Community Strengths and Needs Annual Update

Bluebonnet Trails Community Services (BTCS) conducts a formal Community Needs and Strengths Assessment (CSNA) every three years. The 2023 CSNA (*latest version*) can be accessed here: https://bbtrails.org/wp-content/uploads/2024/02/BTCS-2023-CSNA.pdf.

A Community Strengths and Needs Annual Update is provided annually between CSNAs for the purpose of informing BTCS' strategic planning process. The update summarizes important changes in available data from year to year. *Note: this is the first report to incorporate data from BTCS' primary care electronic health record, eClinicalWorks (eCW).*

The report is structured into three sections for each county: County Characteristics, County Community Strengths, and County Community Needs. The County Characteristics section includes the following table headings, defined below: Category, Indicator, Trend, Rates (Previous vs. Current), County vs. Texas, and Notes. The Category column provides the general topic under which several Indicators may fall. The Trend column utilizes arrows to indicate whether the rate has increased, decreased, or remained the same compared to the previous year's data. The Rates column presents data from both the previous year and the current year to understand the magnitude of the change, if any. The County vs. Texas column shows whether the current rate is higher or lower than the Texas average, which serves as the baseline. Lastly, the Notes column indicates whether the indicator for that county is the highest or lowest among the eight counties served by BTCS. Only the highest and lowest indicators among these counties have been included in this annual update.

For the County Strengths and Needs sections, an additional column titled **Desired Direction** has been included. This column helps to indicate the preferred direction of the trend. If the trend is moving in the desired direction, an arrow is shown in green to indicate improvement. Conversely, if the trend is moving in the opposite direction, the arrow is in red to signify worsening. If the rates have remained the same, the arrow is displayed in gray, pointing to the right. "N/A" under the "Desired Direction" column signifies the desired direction is dependent on the context of the indicator.

The categories within the County Characteristics and subcategory BTCS Served sections are ordered alphabetically, while the categories within the County Community Strengths and County Community Needs sections are arranged as follows: Mental Health, Substance Use, Risk Behaviors, followed by 2023 Strategic Plan priorities: Workforce, Youth, Homelessness, and Aging Population. All other categories are ordered alphabetically.

Appendix A: Secondary Data Indicator Definitions

Data was collected and analyzed for the 8 counties, as well as for Texas. Indicator definitions are provided in the table below.

Indicator	Indicator Definition
Below Poverty Levels	Defined as the use of money income thresholds that vary by family size and composition to determine who is in poverty. If a family's total income is less than the family's threshold, then that family and every individual in it is considered in poverty.
Binge Drinking	When a female has had four or more drinks of alcohol in a row, a male has had five drinks of alcohol in a row, within a couple of hours, on at least 1 day during the past 30 days.
Columbia-Suicide Severity Rating Scale (C-SSRS)	An assessment tool that evaluates suicidal ideation and behavior.
Economically Disadvantaged Students	Students that are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch or other public assistance.
Educational Attainment	People 25 years old and over classified according to the highest degree or the highest level of school completed.
Food Environment Index	A measure that accounts for both proximity to healthy foods and income. This index ranges from 1 (worst) to 10 (best).
Food Insecurity	A household-level economic and social condition of limited or uncertain access to adequate food.
Heavy Alcohol Consumption	Defined as at least one binge drinking episode involving five or more drinks for men and four or more for women over the past 30 days.
Household Income	This includes the income of the householder and all other individuals 15 years old and over in the household during the past 12 months, whether they are related to the householder or not.
Housing Cost Burden	Households where housing costs are 30% or more of total household income.
Individuals with Disabilities	Serious difficulty with four basic areas of functioning – hearing, vision, cognition, and ambulation. This captures six aspects of disability: (hearing, vision, cognitive, ambulatory, self-care, and independent living); which can be used together to create an overall disability measure, or independently to identify populations with specific disability types.
Language Spoken at Home	The language currently used by respondents at home, either "English only" or a non-English language which



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	is used in addition to English or in place of English. "Other Languages" for county data encompass Arabic, Hebrew, African or Afro-Asiatic and all other unspecified languages.
Limited English Proficiency (LEP)	Population 5 years or older who self-identify as speaking English less than "very well."
Patient Health Questionnaire	A multipurpose instrument for screening, diagnosing, monitoring and measuring the severity of depression.
Poor Mental Health Days	Average number of mentally unhealthy days reported in past 30 days (age-adjusted).
Poor or Fair Health	Percentage of adults reporting fair or poor health (age-adjusted).
Poor Physical Health Days	Average number of physically unhealthy days reported in the past 30 days (age-adjusted).
Severe Housing Problems	The percentage of households with one or more of the following problems: 1) lacking complete plumbing facilities, 2) lacking complete kitchen facilities, 3) one or more occupants per room, 4) monthly owner costs as a percentage of household income is greater than 30%, and 5) gross rent as a percentage of household income is greater than 30%.
Smoking Among Adults	The percentage of adults aged 18 and older who report having smoked at least 100 cigarettes in their lifetime and currently smoke every day or some days.
Veterans	A "civilian veteran" is a person 18 years old or over who has served (even for a short time), but is not now serving, on active duty in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, or the Coast Guard, or who served in the U.S. Merchant Marine during World War II.
Youths Not in School and Not Working (Isolated Youth)	Youth ages 16-19 who are not currently enrolled in school and who are not employed.
